Lubbock MSA and Regional Unemployment

Lubbock's MSA unemployment rate for June 2018 was 3.6%, up 0.8% from April's 2.8%. Midland MSA's recorded the lowest unemployment rate at 2.4%, followed by Amarillo at 3.1%. Austin Round Rock, and Odessa MSA's recorded the third lowest rate of 3.2% for June.


